Air New Zealand	5 May 2021: Flights to South Australia resume. 7 April 2021: Following an update from New Zealand and Australian Governments, customers are able to travel quarantine-free between New Zealand and Australia from Monday, 19 April 2021. 20 March 2021: Quarantine-free services to Brisbane recommenced. 15 March 2021: Flights from Niue to New Zealand are on sale now following the announcement of a one-way quarantine-free travel route from Niue to New Zealand. 22 February: Air New Zealand trials global digital travel pass. 12 March 2021: Quarantine-free services to Sydney and Melbourne recommenced. 25 January 2021: From tomorrow, Air New Zealand will require the use of face masks on all international flights to and from New Zealand as a result of updated overseas government border requirements and as a further proactive safety measure to prevent the spread of COVID-19.	https://www.airnewzealand.co.nz/media-releases
Air Niugini	20 April 2021: There are additional changes to the requirements for international travel, effective from Tuesday 20 April. These changes will affect all passengers departing to Australia, as well as to Singapore, Hong Kong, Manila and any other Air Niugini international destinations. All passengers departing internationally will be required to be tested for Covid-19 at time of check-in. This is in addition to the requirement for the negative PCR test conducted within three days of travel. International SOS have been contracted to conduct this test (at no cost to the passenger), and will be conducting this testing at the car park next to the International Terminal (between the terminal and the plaza area). 19 April 2021: Air Vanuatu wishes to advise its Customers that with the recent announcement by the National Disaster Management Office (NDMO) to restrict outbound travel from Efate, all Air Vanuatu services are suspended from Monday 19 April 2021 through to Wednesday 21 April 2021. Hawaiian Airways	4 May: Starting today, Maui County will require all trans-Pacific travelers participating in the State of Hawaii Safe Travels program to take an additional rapid COVID-19 test upon arrival at Kahului Airport. The cost of the post-arrival rapid test will be covered by the County. Those who are fully vaccinated will be exempt from the post-arrival test, provided that they show their original CDC vaccination card or certificate of vaccination downloaded from the CDC's Vaccination Administration Management System (VAMS). Fully vaccinated means receiving both doses of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines or one dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccine, plus 15 days after your final dose. If someone in your party is not fully vaccinated or does not have a CDC vaccination card or certificate, pre-register for the post-arrival COVID-19 test here Opens external link to page that may not meet accessibility guidelines. Only one form is required per party. 20 April: Starting May 11, individuals who have been fully vaccinated in the State of Hawaii may travel inter-island without pre-travel testing or quarantining starting the 15th day after the completion of their vaccination. 20 January: The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has issued an order that goes into effect at 7:01 p.m. HST on Jan. 25, 2021 for all travelers flying to the U.S. from a foreign country.	https://www.hawaiianairlines.com/coronavirus

Jetstar	4 May 2021: Jetstar has resumed international services between Australia and New Zealand, following the announcement of a quarantine free two-way travel bubble between the two countries. Jetstar has announced it will extend the suspension of international flights (excluding trans-Tasman and Pacific Islands) to the end of October 2021, in response to the ongoing Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation. In line with government requirements, from 9 January 2021 face masks must be worn on all Jetstar flights domestically in Australia and internationally. You'll need to wear a mask at the airport, at the boarding gate and throughout your flight, unless you're under 12 years old or have a medical condition that exempts you. Your mask needs to cover your mouth and nose. We recommend you bring your own mask to wear through the airport. Korean Air	24 February 2021: All passengers (including re-entry foreign nationals) must submit a printed PCR test result (written in, or have a certified translation in English or Korean) within 72 hours of departure. 4 January 2021: All foreign nationals entering Korea must submit a PCR negative confirmation issued within 72 hours of departure. Nauru Airlines	18 March 2021: If you are travelling to Nauru, you will be required to undergo additional screening before departure and upon arrival in Nauru. In addition, inflight screening may also take place. Solomon Airlines	22 March 2021: Following approval by the Australian Government, Solomon Airlines has confirmed that passenger seats are now available for sale from Honiara to Brisbane during the month of April 2021. 15 March 2021: Repatriation flights from 19 March to 29 October 2021 are open for bookings to Solomon Islands citizens, and foreign nationals who are self-funding their quarantine accommodation in approved facilities in Honiara with gazetted Prime Minister's Office approval. 3 March 2021: Solomon Airlines schedules repatriation flight between The Philippines, Malaysia and Solomon Islands 11 February 2021: Solomon Airlines has announced a further extension of the suspension of regular scheduled international passenger flights to 30 October 2021. 8 February 2021: Solomon Airlines has confirmed that additional flight options are now available from Honiara to Brisbane on Fridays during the months of February and March 2021.
