
Background

The Global Logistics Cluster (GLC) Emergency Preparedness Project is active in Haiti since 2020, it aims at strengthening national-level humanitarian logistics coordination and information management systems in a context of ongoing emergencies.

The National Logistics Sector is under the leadership of the National Disaster Management Agency, *the Departement General de la Protection Civile* (DGPC) and is co-lead by the World Food Programme. It provides information management and coordination services through regular meetings and facilitate the transition from operations to logistics preparedness activities.

Quarterly highlights

Mobile Storage Unit and Prefab Training in the Dominican Republic



- A Mobile Storage Unit (MSU) and Office prefab assembly training was organized in Santo Domingo in April 2021. The training was facilitated by the Haiti Emergency Preparedness Officer to foster logistics preparedness activities between Haiti and the Dominican Republic.
- The training benefited the Dominican Republic National Laboratory (key actor in the COVID-19 efforts), the Dominican Red Cross and the Centre for Emergency Operations (COE).
- Several units were handed over by the WFP Country Office in Dominican Republic to national actors.

2021 Hurricane season Humanitarian Preparedness

- With the start of the 2021 hurricane season in the Caribbean at the beginning of June, the Logistics Preparedness team in Haiti is ensuring the community is ready to face upcoming emergencies from a logistics standpoint.
- The Logistics Preparedness Focal Point contributed to the contingency planning of the Humanitarian Country Team, ensuring contribution from partners where reflected.
- The implementation of the Logistics Preparedness Platform in Haiti [Log:ie](#) is ongoing, facilitating access to key logistics information in real time.
