

## Highlights

- In June, **551 m<sup>3</sup> of relief items** were received into common storage on behalf of **six organisations** and a total of **3785 m<sup>3</sup> of relief items** are stored on behalf of **19 organisations** in Madhu Chara, Balukhali, Unchiprang and Teknaf Hubs. And transported 124m<sup>3</sup> (36mt) of relief items for two organisation for the fire response.
- Access Road Assessment (ARA) has been completed in nine camps and is put to a halt due the lockdown.
- First draft of the Gaps and Needs Assessment (GNA) report was submitted for review.
- The Logistics Sector organised two days of online Logistics Induction Training in collaboration with Handicap International-Atlas Logistique (HI-Atlas) focusing on **Warehouse and Transportation Management** exclusively in Bangla with **15** participants from seven organisations in attendance.
- The 2021 warehouse capacity assessment was analysed and presented in the coordination meeting. A map consisting of all the partners' warehouses will be produced in the coming week. Based on the 27 submissions received from the Warehouse Capacity Assessment, there are 69 warehouses in Cox's Bazar with a total capacity of 69,239 m<sup>2</sup> with an average capacity of 1,065 m<sup>2</sup>.
- Deployable hubs have been prepared for quick response in cases of emergency in both Madhu Chara and Balukhali including the preposition of standby capacity and are ready for partner visit.
- The Logistics Sector discussed the ways in which green logistics can be promoted with the Solid waste management (SWM) working group. As a result, 50,000 damaged bags have been identified for upcycling.
- The Logistics Sector loaned one ablution unit to Terre Des Hommes (TDH) in Camp 27 and supported them with the installation. The Sector also supported APBN with tent erection in Camp 25.

## Background

In 2021, the Logistics Sector will continue working with partners to address common logistics gaps and challenges in Cox's Bazar and ensure an efficient humanitarian response. The Rohingya Response Strategy will maintain its focus on (I) strengthening collaboration amongst international and national partners, (II) synchronising logistics decisions, (III) producing and sharing key information, and (IV) facilitating access to common logistics services to support partners' logistics operations. In the lead-up to the monsoon and ensuing cyclone seasons, the Logistics Sector focuses its efforts on preparedness activities, planning, and reinforcing partner capacities to support effective decision making, the Logistics Sector provides technical logistics advice and access to storage facilities to the organisations facing supply chain challenges

## Logistics services

- In June, **551 m<sup>3</sup> of relief items** were received into common storage on behalf of **six organisations** making it a total of **3785 m<sup>3</sup> (1284 mt) relief items** stored on behalf of **19 organisations** in Madhu Chara, Balukhali, Unchiprang and Teknaf hubs. Items stored include tarpaulins, canopies tents, jerry cans, cement, bookshelves, school benches and face masks. HI-Atlas transported **124 m<sup>3</sup> (36 mt) of relief items** on behalf of **two organisations**.
- Between October 2017 and June 2021, the Logistics Sector received a total of **51, 517 m<sup>3</sup> (19,480 mt)** relief items on behalf of **45 organisations**.

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
