Australia	Australia's borders are currently closed and entry to Australia remains strictly controlled to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Travel to Australia is only available if you are exempt or you have been granted an individual exemption. You are automatically exempt from the travel restrictions and can enter Australia (without obtaining an individual exemption) if you are an Australian citizen, a permanent resident of Australia, an immediate family member of an Australian citizen or permanent resident, a New Zealand citizen usually resident in Australia and their immediate family members, a person who has been in New Zealand or Australia for 14 days or more immediately prior to arrival by air in Australia, a diplomat accredited to Australia, including their immediate family members (each member of the family unit must hold a valid subclass 995 visa), a person transiting Australia for 72 hours or less, airline crew, maritime crew including marine pilots, a person recruited under the Government approved Seasonal Worker Program or Pacific Labour Scheme, a person who holds a Business Innovation and Investment (subclass 188) visa. Fiji	Passengers are not permitted to enter or transit through Fiji. Fiji nationals must hold a negative PCR test obtained within 72 hours prior to departure if they are travelling from a country determined as a high risk for Covid-19, and have confirmed this via pereeza.ali@govnet.gov.fj or crmt@govnet.gov.fj . Foreign nationals and Fiji residents travelling to Fiji must hold a negative quantitative RT-PCR or Cepheid GeneXpert test certificate obtained within 72 hours prior to departure. The test result must include the laboratory letter head and laboratory contact details, patient details, type of sample collected, date of sample collection, date test was conducted, type of test conducted, lab sample number, and name of lab supervisor/staff signing off on the result. Japan	From January 14, 2021 until further notice, all Japanese nationals and foreign nationals with the status of residence are also required to pledge to refrain from using public transportation for 14 days, and to be in quarantine at home or other designated areas for 14 days, retain the location data, and provide it to the health centers or other institutions, if requested. (If separate quarantine measures are to be taken, those also need to be pledged.) They are required to sign and submit the Written Pledge(PDF) Open a New Window when entering Japan. In case of violation, they may be subject to detention under Quarantine Act and the following shall apply: (i) For Japanese nationals, names and other information that contribute to preventing the spread of infection may be made public. (ii) For foreign nationals with the status of residence, names, nationalities, and other information that contribute to preventing the spread of infection may be made public. They may also be subject to the revocation of status of residence and procedures for deportation under Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Law. Due to the current COVID-19 development in Fiji and other parts of the world, the following is now re-enforced for all passengers; I. A Negative rtPCR COVID test is required to be taken within 72 hours of departure from originating airport. The lab result must be presented in hard copy on arrival into Samoa. II. Medical Clearance signed and done within 120 hours of departure from originating airport. The medical clearance must be presented in hard copy on arrival into Samoa. III. Blood Serology for COVID19 Antibody Test within 5 days before departure from originating airport. Must be presented in hard copy on arrival into Samoa. IV. All travellers originating from New Zealand or have stayed for 30 days or more are EXEMPTED from (III) above for blood serology test. Expect this requirement to change for JUNE and JULY 2021 repatriation flights. V. Expect quarantine as determined by the Ministry of Health depending on flight details and country of origin. All passengers travelling from outside of American Samoa must have spent 28 or more days in American Samoa before travelling to Samoa. All travelers will be assessed on a case-by-case basis before being granted permission to travel to Samoa. A passenger holding a valid airline ticket to Samoa has been pre-approved by the Samoan Government to travel is required to provide: Medical Clearance signed and done within 72 hours of departure. The medical clearance must be presented in hard copy on arrival; ; COVID-19 rtPCR test reports within 72 hours before departure presented in hard copy on arrival; passengers who have completed COVID-19 vaccination should provide evidence from a certified provider stating dates of first and second doses, with name of vaccine used and stamp of provider for verification; expect exemption from quarantine on arrival although this requirement may change without notice from time to time depending on COVID-19 risk status. All travellers serving their 21-day SHN will undergo the COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests on-arrival, on Day 14 of their SHN, and another test before the end of their 21-day SHN period. Travellers who have stayed in Fiji and Vietnam in the past consecutive 21 days will be subjected to a 21-day SHN at dedicated facilities, with the option to serve the last 7 days at their place of residence.
